In the Senate of the Undergraduate Student Body here assembled,

- 1. **WHEREAS** the University is in a time of strained financial resources, causing budgetary
- 2. restrictions; and
- 3. **WHEREAS** the University does not have the funds for the continuation of the fee waiver
- 4. program beyond the Fall 2008 semester; and
- 5. WHEREAS the Center for International Programs (CIP) is facing a carryover budget
- 6. deficit of 2.5 million dollars; and
- 7. **WHEREAS** the CIP conducts immigration advising for international students,
- 8. scholars and undergraduate international admissions; and
- 9. **WHEREAS** the University has spent 12 million dollars on international fee waivers
- 10. since the year 2000; and
- 11. WHEREAS international fee waivers were neither needs tested or merit based; and
- 12. **WHEREAS** international fee waivers were given out directly from the CIP without any
- 13. input from the Office of Financial Aid; and
- 14. **WHEREAS** the CIP formerly reported to Continuing and Extended Education; and
- 15. **WHEREAS** on July 1, 2008 the CIP moved under the Office of the Provost; and
- 16. **WHEREAS** the Office of the Provost became aware of the 2.5 million dollar deficit and
- 17. acted in a fiscally responsible manner to address the situation; and
- 18. **WHEREAS** the number of students on fee waivers has been reduced from 227 students
- 19. in 2006 to forty-two for the Spring 2009 semester; and
- 20. **WHEREAS** the current leadership of the CIP has reduced the amount spent on
- 21. international fee waivers since Fall 2006 by 60%; and
- 22. **WHEREAS** the CIP already has several newer programs that are producing positive
- 23. revenue streams to the CIP such as the faculty exchange program and the Bowling Green
- 24. Language Institute, located in Moseley Hall; and

- 25. **WHEREAS** the I-20 form is not a contractual agreement between the University
- 26. and individual international students that guarantees the waiver of tuition and fees by the
- 27. University, but a document that certifies that both the University and student will
- 28. comply with the administrative regulations and federal laws governing international
- 29. students; and
- 30. WHEREAS international students are obligated under The United States Citizenship and
- 31. Immigration Services regulations governing international students to demonstrate
- 32. financial ability to pay for their schooling; and
- 33. **WHEREAS** the CIP has already researched and worked closely with students to explore
- 34. options that include external funding;
- 35. **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the individual students meet with the director
- 36. of the CIP, a financial aid officer from the Office of Financial Aid, a representative from
- 37. the Bursar's Office, and the students' academic advisor to construct an academic plan to
- 38. prepare them to graduate as soon as possible and a financial plan that will help them pay
- 39. for the remainder of their education that may include scholarships, grants, and student
- 40. loans; and
- 41. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the BGSU Undergraduate Student Government
- 42. supports the CIP's future plans to become more financially self-supporting and
- 43. less dependent on the University's general funds; and
- 44. **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that upon passage in the Senate, this resolution
- 45. shall be submitted to the President of the Undergraduate Student Body for approval or
- 46. veto.
