A Resolution Supporting the Ban of Plastic Bags in Bowling Green State University

In the Senate of the Undergraduate Student Body here assembled,

- 1. Whereas, the Undergraduate Student Government represents the undergraduate student
- 2. voice at Bowling Green State University; and
- 3. Whereas, Bowling Green State University and the Undergraduate Student Government
- 4. aim to ensure all student voices are represented within the Senate; and
- 5. Whereas, BGSU's Climate Action Plan strives to achieve carbon-neutrality by 2040 through
- 6. the reduction of emissions, waste reduction & resource conservation, and education,
- 7. awareness and outreach; and
- 8. Whereas, Plastic bags take multiple centuries to decompose in landfills or as pollutants in
- 9. the environment, and are not commonly recycled; and
- 10. Whereas, Members of the Environmental Action Group (EAG) have repeatedly lobbied to
- 11. the body of USG for resolutions and legislation to be passed supporting waste reduction
- 12. efforts, including plastic bag reductions and distribution bans; and
- 13. Whereas, EAG has lead grassroots efforts to gather hundreds of student signatures on a
- 14. petition to ban the distribution of plastic bags on campus; and
- 15. Whereas, the President's Advisory Committee on Sustainability (PACS) is charged with
- 16. implementing the Climate Action Plan though initiatives such as these and supports this
- 17. initiative; and
- 18. Whereas, sustainable alternatives such as reusable bags are already readily sold on campus;
- 19. And
- 20. Whereas, education and incentivization of the use of reusable bags are to be a joint initiative
- 21. of members of EAG, PACS, USG and The Office of Sustainability
- 22. Whereas, recycled paper bags are similar in cost and have less of a carbon footprint than
- 23. plastic bags and other alternatives exist that could be phased in to replace plastic
- 24. Therefore, let it be resolved that, the Undergraduate Student Government of Bowling
- 25. Green State University supports a ban of the distribution of plastic bags on BGSU's
- 26. campus.
