



## FACULTY VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT

Qualified-Rank, Assistant Teaching Professor, Career Tech Workforce Education  
College of Education and Human Development  
School of Inclusive Teacher Education

### **Summary**

The School of Inclusive Teacher Education invites applications for a qualified rank, non-tenure track, Assistant Teaching Professor in Career Tech Workforce Education with a start date of August 2025. This is a nine-month, non-renewable appointment.

The Career Tech Workforce Education (CTWE) program has two distinct programs of study. The on-campus, undergraduate program focus is teacher preparation in the areas of business and marketing education and family and consumer science education, while the fully online alternative program focus is Career Tech licensure preparation for individuals already hired by school districts, many of whom have come directly from industry or have non-CT teacher licensure in another area.

The School of Inclusive Teacher Education, housed within the College of Education and Human Development, is committed to building and sustaining a dynamic, collaborative community of highly skilled teachers for all levels of education, thereby increasing graduates' options and those of their students for lives as independent, productive, and contributing citizens. The School advocates for rigorous scholarship, innovative teaching and learning, and civic and professional engagement that places high value on the diversity of individuals and communities in a global society. The School serves approximately 1500 undergraduate students and nearly 500 graduate students in seven initial licensure programs and four graduate programs, with numerous endorsements and certificates. These programs are guided by more than fifty full-time faculty and staff.

The College of Education and Human Development, BGSU's founding college, is the home to a dynamic group of graduate and undergraduate programs, housed across three academic units: the School of Applied Human Development; the School of Counseling, Higher Education, Leadership, and Foundations; and the School of Inclusive Teacher Education. Approximately 150 full-time faculty and staff serve over 3,000 undergraduate students and over 1,000 graduate students. The College promotes and supports a community of inclusion, collaboration, and respect for students, faculty, and staff. This strong sense of community serves as the central tenet for the College's priorities for integrating professional preparation, leadership and service, experiential learning, and inquiry and innovation in all academic programs and related experiences. The College has extensive partnerships across professional, school, and community settings that facilitate collaboration for student experiences and research opportunities.

### **Essential Functions**

As a qualified rank, Assistant Teaching Professor, candidates will have an 80/20 teaching to service workload. Specific responsibilities include:

- Teach undergraduate and graduate Career Tech Workforce Education courses (12 credit hour teaching load).
- Contribute to the school, college, university, and the profession through select service activities.
- Collaborate in program development.
- Work with constituencies outside the university.

### **Minimum Qualifications**

- Earned master's degree, specialist's degree and/or doctorate in an education and/or an education related field.
- Minimum of three years teaching experience in grades 4-12 career and technical education with an Ohio or other state professional teaching license.
- Evidence of a leadership and service record.
- Previous experience with or knowledge of alternative models of preparing career and technical teachers.

### **Preferred Qualifications**

- Experience developing courses at the undergraduate and graduate level.
- Effective teaching experience at the college level in multiple modalities (including fully online).
