












Introduction

31.2%






Only 1 in 3 graduate in 4 years*

*BGSU (2013 Cohort)









How is BGSU doing?






The Cost of An Extra Year

The Cost of An Extra Year

- On average, BGSU students graduate with just over \$31,000 in debt.
- Repaying that debt in 10 years, results in \$8,500 in interest. That takes the total cost of tuition and instructional fees to \$51,000.
- Attending BGSU for an extra year would result in an average debt of over \$37,000 causing \$10,300 of interest over 10 years.
- The total cost of an extra year at BGSU including tuition, interest, and lost income* is over \$109,000.






What is College Credit Plus?

- Ohio's College Credit Plus (CCP) can help students earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking college courses from a public college or university.
- Public school students can take CCP courses at no cost for tuition, books or fees.
- Classes can be taken on a college campus, online, or at their high school.
- During 2017-18, 12% of all Ohio ninth through twelfth grade students participated in CCP courses.


CCP Impact on Retention

Entering with CCP Credits from BGSU	>83%			








Common Myths of CCP

- Classes taken for CCP do NOT count in the GPA MYTH!
- Any credit taken through CCP will count for credits toward a college major – MYTH!
- CCP classes will allow seamless transitions to upper level classes (ex. MATH 1310 CCP credit equals readiness for MATH 2320) - MYTH!
- Hours transferred in guarantees a shorter time to graduation (60 hours of CCP=2 years until College Degree) - MYTH!

CCP Case Study

Jacquelyn L.

- Transferred in 60 hours of CCP credits to BGSU
- Wants Intervention Specialist degree
- Worked with BGSU CCP Advisor to carefully manage CCP courses
- Graduating in 3 years








Recommendations

At the High School Level

- Increase transparency for CCP students and parents regarding CCP Pathways
- Provide training for high school counselors
- Require students to consult with BGSU CCP Advisor/Advocate
- Enroll in recommended BGP courses to ensure transferability


